Tell Me a Story

The melody and words of a song paint a musical story, but a good performance is more than just singing the notes and words correctly. Jack Benny once said, "Get the audience to like you as soon as possible." One of the best ways to connect with them is by telling our story the best we possibly can.

Think about the message you are trying to convey to our audience when you sing. Make sure your facial expression and body language help tell the story. Hold your music up, look at the audience (and you can see the director better that way too), smile, raise your eyebrows, look enthusiastic, and sell the song. You'll be surprised how good you will feel and how much more our audience will enjoy the music we bring to them.

Our Practice Schedule

We have two practices each month, on the two Mondays before the first Thursday of the month. Sometimes the second practice will be on the Monday of the week of our first performance. This sounds a lot more complicated than it is, so just check our monthly calendar to be sure.

With only two practices before we sing a program, it's important to attend at least one of them if possible. We all have commitments that may keep us away, but it helps if you know the way we are singing the music and any changes we may make at practice. Our

Upon retirement in 1987, Bob and Arlene moved to Raymond, Colorado, where they lived for 15 years. They moved here in 2002 and were familiar with Las Cruces because their daughter lived here. They also had stopped here often to fill their motorhome's water tank enroute to Texas or Arizona. Arlene died in 2012, but many of us still remember her fondly.

Flonnie Cross has been singing with Young at Heart since she moved to Las Cruces from Apache Junction, Arizona in 2005. Born in Casa Grande, she married her husband, Jerry, in 1955. While living in Arizona, she ran a clothing store for 20 years and then sold real estate for 15 years.

Singing is a big part of Flonnie's life. She sings with the regular and senior choirs at First Baptist Church and also has been a regular in the church's Living Christmas Tree for many years. While singing with Young at Heart, Flonnie also backs up Joy in the rhythm section. She and Jerry also enjoy going to the Senior Dances in town.

Flonnie left Arizona to find a climate that was better for her MS and came to New Mexico in part because Jerry was born in the state, at Santa Rita. They have three sons, seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.
